Areas of Ministry: Toddler Church

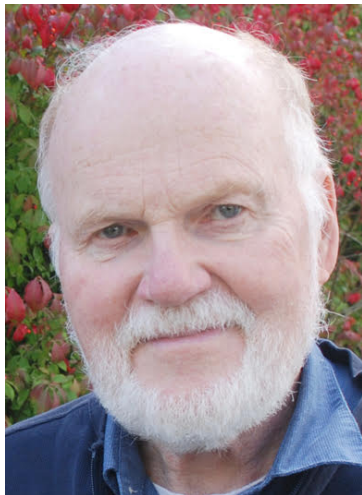
